The Healthy Harvest Day brought a good number of new visitors to the Gáirdín. We had several enquiries regarding how the garden operates and how people can become volunteers. Therefore, we hope to welcome some new people to the work and pleasure of gardening.

The workshop for children on seed planting was well attended. Many children went away with seeds in pots and the instructions on how to care for the plant as it grows. We hope in time we have started an interest in growing in the next generation.

To date this year, we have grown a good crop of potatoes, which we have now harvested. We have been using tomatoes, cabbage, kale, spinach, onions and beetroot as well as salad crops as they have matured.

It will soon be time to rest most of the garden for the Winter. There are some crops which benefit from an early start the following year if they are planted in Autumn. It may be worth

giving it a try this Autumn if the ground is not too wet! We can use the polytunnel in the really cold months, that will be a big benefit.
